Plan:

Objective: To enhance the library's learning environment with flexible, high-quality facilities tailored to the diverse educational and training needs of staff and students.

Strategy: Offer serene, private study and collaborative spaces, including sound-insulated study pods suitable for individual discussions and virtual meetings.

Wellbeing: Prioritize the health and comfort of users by providing facilities that support and elevate the learning experience.

Do:

Assessment: Evaluated the current library spaces to identify the need for pod/booth facilities.

Market Research: Investigated suppliers offering the required products.

Collaboration: Partnered with education leads, estates, health and safety, Skanska, and Project Co. to revamp the library, incorporating flexible learning areas.

Design Consultation: Engaged with designers and architects to scope and create dedicated device-friendly areas for meetings and training.

Study:

Innovation: Recognized that study pods offer a modern, welcoming look and a dual-purpose solution.

Design Evaluation: Invited three design firms to propose concepts, specifications, and plans for the library spaces.

Site Visits: Companies conducted on-site assessments of pod prototypes to determine their fit.

Cost Analysis: A comparative financial review was performed of the proposals received.

Selection: Dalen Ltd chosen for their personalized approach and hands-on product demonstrations.

Act:

Implementation: Library pods installed in March 2023.

Space Organization: Reconfigured the library to establish group study zones.


Booking System: Implemented BookWise Solutions for pod reservations, allowing users to choose based on their preferences.

Evaluation: Plan to gather user feedback experience in Summer 2024 to assess impact and effectiveness.
